In the 2019-2020 budget the City Council experimented with a \$10,000 match grant for each service club sponsoring one or more parks. Both the Lion's Club and Rotary Club were able to provide beautiful upgrades to their respective parks. The Lion's Club added new playground equipment at Lion's Park. The Rotary Club added a walking trail around Rotary Laxson Park.

Because of the success of that program, we have continued to provide a match for the 2020-2021 year. The money you had set aside for matching funds will remain in an account for your club to match year over year. Your club will only be required to match the first \$10,000 dollar for dollar to access the additional funds. After the initial \$10,000 is matched, you can access the additional funding at lower levels.

If your club intends to use the matching funds, we are requesting that your club let the city know what your plans are so that they can be included in the city's budget documents. Our budget document will go to print in May so if you could let us know your plans by the end of April, that would be much appreciated.

The City Parks Commission wanted to reach out to you to express how much we appreciate and value your partnership with our City parks. The City's parks master plan can be updated at any time as your service clubs work collaboratively with us to create plans for your parks.
