Moore Park – Dan Cummings

- Elaborated on the options to “adopt” the Moore Park.

- Or they could adopt the park with activities such as cleanups or project ideas.
- Dan also explained how the city matching funds could be added to this park, if an organization was to request it.

COMMENTS FROM COMMITTEE MEMBERS

- Michael Braden gave an update on the ODF Trees grant. The signing of the contract has been delayed. Everything is being reviewed by the Dept. of Justice (for legal sufficiency review). Once the contract is finalized, the city will organize the TAC technical advisory committee. Michael Braden, Marc Berg, and Tyler Whitaker all volunteered to be a part of that committee.
- Casey Mordhorst from JACOBS commented on the number of tree-related businesses, who have been emailing him. Mostly, software companies, designed to capture and record the tree inventory. Michael Braden commented that ODF wants us to use their Tree Plotter software for the inventory.
- Casey also had some updates on the budget. Several initiatives were approved for the parks this year, including \$100,000 budgeted for items, such as sidewalks. Beck Pond is slated to have an ADA ramp installed down to the water (from the parking lot), as well as a floating dock placed in the water, for fishing in the pond.
- Laxson Rotary Park - The basketball court was resurfaced. Some neighbors commented that it was a peculiar blue color.
- Lanterman Park - Casey reported that the center of the park has not had any watering for the past two weeks. A sprinkler pump needed to be replaced, and two contractors were unable to come do repairs. The pump is now replaced, and the sprinklers are back on. Two newer trees are dead. Two are close to dying. The ten trees south of the pavilion were the most affected. Kiwanis club went out this weekend and watered all the trees. But they will need several weeks of observation.
- Marc and Michael are collecting names of landscapers, designers, arborists, and local enthusiasts who want to be a part of the upcoming tree plantings.
